One of the unique features of the Survey of International Air Travelers (Survey) is its 'data-mining' potential. The Survey research data, collected from the questionnaire, is maintained in a computer database. Therefore, customized ad-hoc reports, special tables, data files, or diskettes can be developed if the standard pre-formatted reports do not meet your needs.

Customized reports, tables or data files enable you to choose the format and content to answer questions you have about non-resident travelers to the United States or U.S. resident travel to international destinations. A combined year report, i.e., 2015 – 2017, can easily be developed.

International Travel to the United States (I-94)

The National Travel and Tourism Office (NTTO)

collects monthly visitation data based on the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) **I-94** arrivals records, which gives a total count of non-U.S. travelers to the United States from overseas countries. **I-94** Mexico data are available for air travelers. Aggregate travel data are obtained from Banco de Mexico. Canada arrival data are obtained directly from Statistics Canada.

I-94 data can help you learn more about:

- Visitor 'visa' types (e.g., B, F, M, WB/WT): Business, Pleasure and Students, plus other codes
- Country/world region of origin (based on residency, however available by citizenship)
- Mode of travel (air, sea and land)
- Minimum stay (more than one night)
- Demographics (age, gender)
- Port of entry
- Address (state) while in the United States
- Country/world region
- Inbound flight level data only

Overseas travelers are from countries for which a visa is required, or from visa-waiver countries. Prior to departure, travelers from visa-waiver countries are required to complete an on-line application with DHS in the Electronic System for Travel Authorization.

The U.S. Department of Commerce focuses on non-resident arrival traffic as a basis for developing travel 'export' estimates. **I-94** data are also used to expand the survey estimates developed by the *Overseas Travelers – Survey of International Air Travelers* (inbound) program.

Survey of International Air Travelers (SIAT) Inbound

The **SIAT** is a primary research program that uses sampling methodologies to collect performance data from two separate populations of international travelers¹. In this instance, the **SIAT** collects

- **Non-U.S. travelers who visit the United States (Weighted to the I-94 program/inbound)**

Data are collected from airline passengers who use U.S. or foreign flag carriers (70 plus participants).

- True origin-destination (O&D) via airport gateway, based on country of residence
 - U.S. cities/states visitation (**inbound**)
- Trip planning process (e.g., sources used and decision timing)
- Traveler characteristics (e.g., purpose of trip, travel party, length of trip)

- Rating information (available only to airlines and airports)
- Leisure activities undertaken by travelers
- Demographics (age, gender, income, residence, citizenship, etc.)

U.S. International Air Travel Statistics APIS (formerly I-92)

NTTO reports monthly data based on the U.S. Department of Homeland Security **Advanced Passenger Information System (APIS) (formerly I-92)** arrival/departure records, which gives a total count of all non-stop air traffic that arrives in the United States and that departs from the United States.

Breakouts include:

- U.S. citizen and non-U.S. citizen air traffic (differentiating characteristics from the BTS T-100)
- U.S. carriers and foreign flag carriers
- Scheduled and charter flights
- U.S. and foreign gateway airports
- Countries and regions

The U.S. Department of Commerce focuses on U.S. citizen departure traffic as a basis for developing travel "import" estimates.

U.S. citizen departure traffic is also used to expand the survey estimates developed by the *U.S. Travelers – Survey of International Air Travelers* (outbound) program. Data are collected from airline passengers who use U.S. or foreign flag carriers (70 plus participants).

 - Overseas countries visited (**outbound**)
- Trip planning process (e.g., sources used and decision timing)
- Traveler characteristics (e.g., purpose of trip, travel party, length of trip)

- Rating information (available only to airlines and airports)
- Leisure activities undertaken by travelers
- Demographics (age, gender, income, residence, citizenship, etc.)
