- (1) Total U.S. (NET) reflects non-duplicated parties. These totals are not revised when Statistics Canada revises total visitor estimates.
- (2) Total U.S. (SUM) and regional totals sum the visits across U.S. regions and states. Thus, the sum totals include possible double-counting of travelers who visit more than one state. State details may not sum to totals due to rounding.
- (3) Based on industry recommendation, NTTO policy is to suppress state data for which sample size is fewer than 400. This policy is suspended for travel year 2015 data so that each state has at least a one-point estimate of volume. For these small-sample states, changes in annual volume estimates will be subject to a higher degree of 'normal' sampling error and thus have larger swings in volume change up or down than if sample levels were larger. Sample levels are rounded to hundreds up or down by Statistics Canada. Zero sample reflects a level of less than 50. Sample levels are provided in Table A. Blank cells reflect data suppression by Statistics Canada.

Note: Totals for Canada may differ across tables due to differences in response rates for questions.
